

Olympic Games 1896 The photographic album of Albert Meyer



In 1896, Albert Meyer (Dresden 1857-1924), one of the bestknown German art photographers, accompanied his country's delegation to Athens, as emissary of the German Committee, in order to photograph the Olympic Games. His purpose was to document the Olympic Games and put together a commemorative album, intended for the German Royal Court and the International Olympic Committee. Meyer's photographs, printed using the platinotype process, which provided a broad tonal range, offer a rather austere documentation of the event. They mostly depict athletes in rather severe poses in the Panathenaic Stadium, shot as if they were in a photographer's studio, just before or immediately after their event. Because Meyer's archives were totally destroyed during the bombing of Berlin in the Second World War, the documentation of Meyer which we have today is very sparse and, consequently, the existence of this particular album takes on special importance. The album contains 25 loose photographs pasted on to a frame. Apart from their value as documentation of a historic world event, they can undoubtedly be described as 'art' photographs, from the point of view of their photography technique and from that of the quality of the reproduction. This particular album belonged to one of the most distinguished members of the Athenian society of the time, Georgios Streit (1868-1948), who acquired it in his capacity as Secretary of the Olympic Games Committee (1896). The album subsequently passed into the Yeroulanos family, who donated it to the Historical Archives of the Benaki Museum.






















